

PUBLIC NOTICE
CITY OF TALLAHASSEE
HOME-ARP Allocation Plan Amendment

In 2021, the Department of Housing and Urban Development’s (HUD or the Department) Office of Community Planning and Development (CPD) allocated \$5 billion appropriated by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARP) of 2021 to HOME Investment Partnerships Program participating jurisdictions. These funds, known as “HOME-ARP,” are intended to give you the financial tools to assist your most vulnerable citizens by providing housing, shelter, tenant-based rental assistance, and supportive services for persons experiencing or at risk of homelessness, fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking, and other populations at greatest risk of housing instability. HUD originally designated a HOME-ARP grant for the City of Tallahassee in the amount of \$3,412,463.00. On April 30, 2025, HUD allocated additional HOME-ARP funds to continue addressing homelessness and other eligible activities. Tallahassee is amending its HOME-ARP Allocation Plan for submission to HUD outlining the City’s planned use of the additional HOME-ARP funds for the purpose of assisting individuals and families who are experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness.

A 7-day public comment period to amend the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan will begin on June 4, 2025, and will expire on June 11, 2025. By this notice the City of Tallahassee announces the availability of the proposed amendment for public review and comment.

On Wednesday, June 11, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. during an in-person meeting at City Hall, the Tallahassee City Commission will hold a public hearing on the proposed amendment to the HOME-ARP Allocation Plan in conjunction with its 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan. Use of the funds is outlined below to implement eligible homelessness activities.

One-Time Additional Award Received:
HOME American Rescue Plan (HOME-ARP): \$5,118.00.

Homeless Prevention to provide relocation and stabilization services to prevent an individual or family from moving into an emergency shelter and Repaid Rehousing to provide housing relocation and stabilization to help a homeless individual or family move as quickly as possible into permanent housing and achieve stability in that housing.	\$5,118.00
